# Paradise Canyon Elementary School Parent Engagement Policy

- We have a parent training course twice a month to teach parents English/Spanish in a content. For instance, we teach the parents how to log into PowerSchool to check their student's grades and we teach that in Spanish and English.

- will share the responsibility for improved student achievement. The compact will be distributed through the school handbook and revisited at each SEP.
- Parent meetings and conferences will be held at various times to meet the needs of all families.
- The Parent Academic meetings and Community Council meeting schedules will be posted at the beginning of the school year at the school on Facebook and on the school website.
- Parents are invited and encouraged to attend all scheduled meetings to share ideas for school improvement to bring about increased student achievement and school community success.
